CLINICAL GOVERNANCE

The Institute of Medicine, USA in their report published in year 2001, came out with the finding, by which about 44000-98000 patients die every year in USA from the preventable medical errors. In India, we are yet to develop system to monitor

medical errors happening in the country and therefore cannot be sure of effectiveness of our clinical outcomes. Clinical governance is emerging concept, which has made a great impact in the healthcare delivery systems in the countries like UK and Australia and which has helped these countries to provide safer and effective healthcare to the patients.



Clinical governance is a broad term, which represents the ways by which healthcare organization ensures that every care delivered to the patients is safe, effective, efficient and evidence based. Clinical governance therefore is systematic approach for institutionalizing of PATIENT CENTRIC service in a hospital setting. Important components of clinical governance are;

- 1 Leadership
- 2 Education & Training
- 3 Risk Assessment and Management
- 4 Clinical Audits
- 5 Information Management
- 6 Clinical Effectiveness
- 7 Patient Centeredness


One day course on Clinical Governance aims to familiarize professionals, engaged with delivery of medical services, with the above components in a reasonable detail.

CLINICAL AUDIT

Clinical Audit can be defined as the systematic analysis of the quality of healthcare

including the procedures used for diagnosis & treatment, the use of resources & the resulting outcome and quality of care for patient. Clinical audit is by far the most important component of Clinical Governance. It was developed as a process by which multi-disciplinary team reviews their clinical practices and bring changes as appropriate on continuous basis.

Clinical audit needs to be a strategic priority under the clinical governance function in each



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healthcare organisation. Clinical audit as mentioned above, is to carry out effective review of clinical performance against agreed standards with built-in improvement process. It is one of the key assessment tools for national and international accrediting organization in estimating of patient safety compliance.

STAGES OF CLINICAL AUDIT

- 1 Identify problem or issue
- 2 Set the criteria & standard
- 3 Observe practice/data collection
- 4 Compare performance with criteria & standards
- 5 Implementing change
- 6 Re-audit & sustaining improvements
