Policy & Advocacy

Package Rationalization for Procedures:

AHPI has been approached National Health Authority [NHA] for the package rationalization in hospitals across the Country. Current prevailing rates from 26 specialities across the country was shared with NHA. An internal committee for the same was formed by AHPI to obtain the data. To discuss further a meeting is being scheduled with the NHA.

First Meeting with the Officials of NHA and AHPI was held on the 3rd February 2022.

Few Points that were discussed during the meeting which is soon to be implemented:


- Package Rates [revision annually, dynamic and realistic, different package rates for patients with comorbidities, cost of implants, high end diagnostics and drugs to be added on to basic price, timely payment (including 'Green Channel'), Interest for delayed payments (already exists in the MoU of central scheme)
- New procedures to be included
- Prevention of scheme misuse
- Prompt redressal of grievance [mechanism to be setup]

Loan & Credit Facility for Hospitals





Health Quality Upgradation Enabled through Space Technology [Health QUEST] -A study with ISRO - SEMI & AHPI. The Health QUEST Study incorporating the best practices of ISRO into the emergency setup at hospitals is being conducted in around 13 hospitals from various parts of the country, with a mix of both NABH and Non-NABH accreditation. The Pre-intervention phase of the study has been completed and the data has been compiled. Following this, training will be imparted and post intervention phase of the study will begin, during which time an in person meeting with ISRO is being planned.






