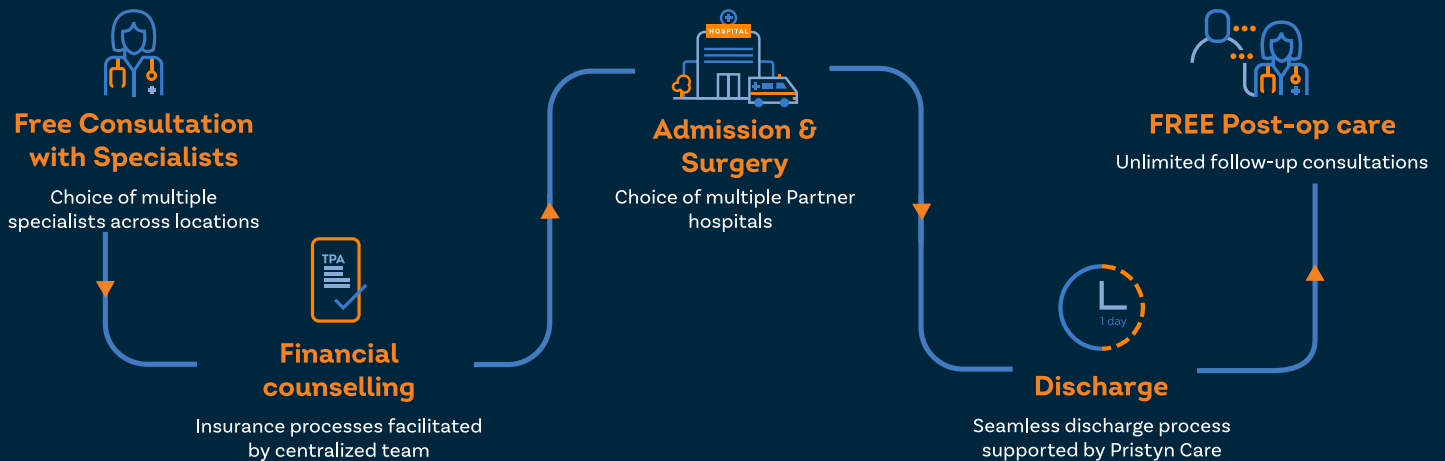

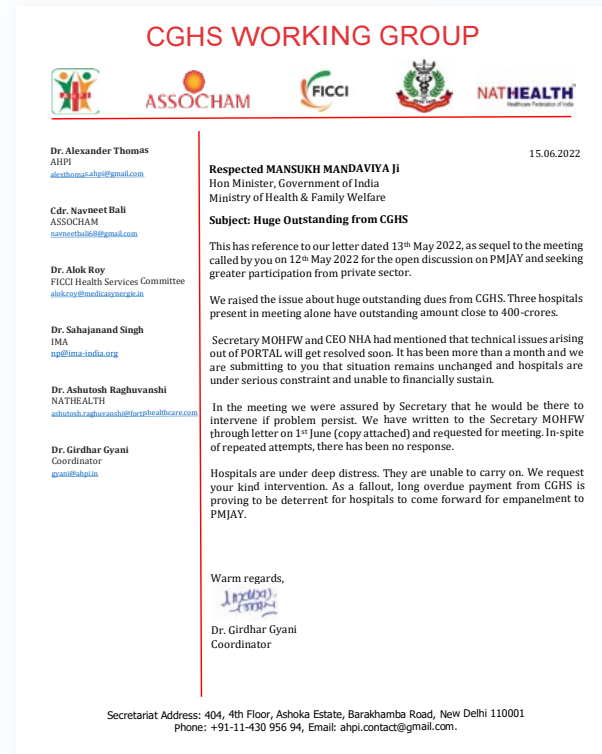

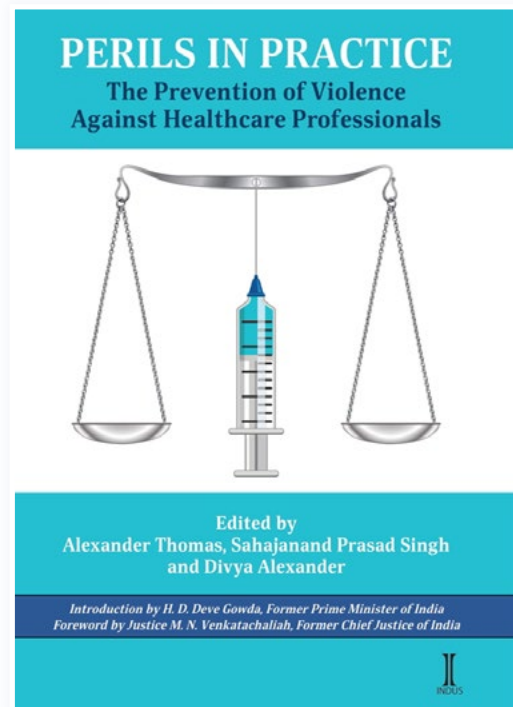
AHPI - Prevention of Violence against Medical Professionals

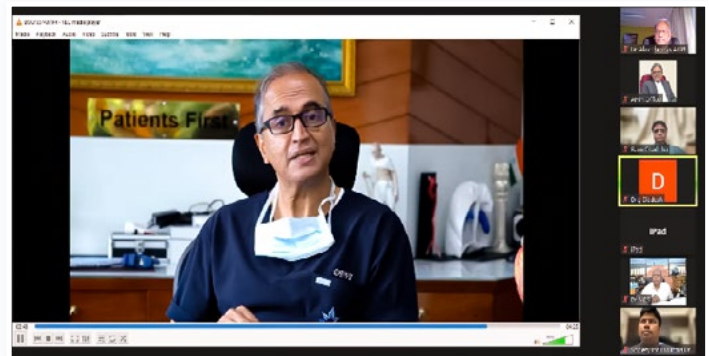

Towards this end, a Health Insurance Consultative Committee is hereby constituted for a period of two years as follows:

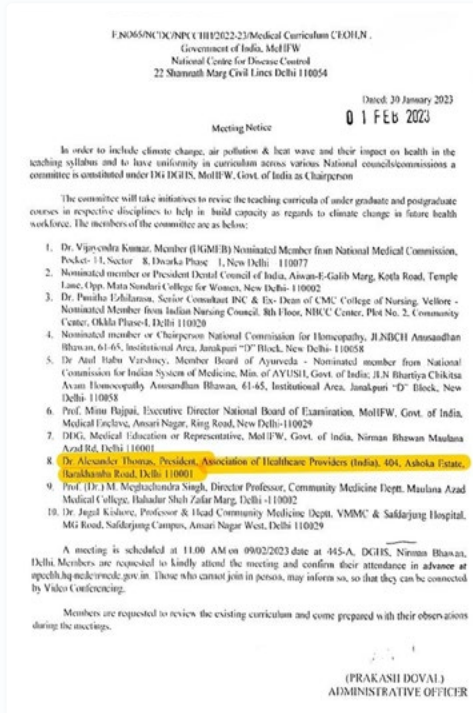

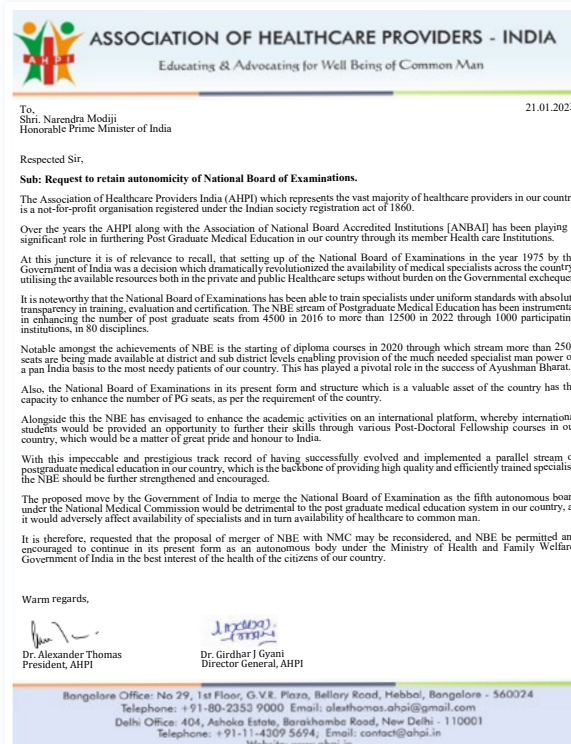

Coming soon: QR code to check if meds are fake

You will soon be able to check if that pill you are popping in is safe and not spurious. The government plans to launch a 'track and trace' mechanism for top-selling medicines to prevent the use of counterfeit and sub-standard medicines and ensure quality, sources told **TOL**.

In the first phase, 300 top-selling drugs will print or affix barcodes or quick response (QR) codes on their 'primary' packaging labels. Primary is the first-level product packaging, such as the bottle, can, jar or tube that contains the

saleable items. Widely sold antibiotics, cardiac, pain-relief pills and anti-allergics with an MRP of over Rs 100 per strip are expected to be included.

The move, though conceptualised a decade ago, was in abeyance due to lack of preparedness in domestic pharma industry. Even for exports, the track and trace mechanism has been deferred till April next year.

Over the years, there have been several instances of counterfeit and substandard drugs in the market, some seized by state drug regulators. Recently, among the major cases that came to light, Abbott said its thyroid medication

Thyronorm that was listed by the Telangana drugs authority as "not of standard quality" was counterfeit and not manufactured or marketed by it.

TRACK & TRACE MECHANISM

- > There have been several reports of fake or sub-standard drugs, some seized by authorities too
- > According to the WHO, 1 in 10 medicines in low- & middle-income countries belong to this category
- > The proposed system will allow consumers to scan barcode/QR codes and enter them on a govt website
- > The code will authenticate the drug with further info about the pharma co, expiry date as well as the brand
- > The first phase may cover the top 300 selling drugs with the code printed on primary package (like the medicine's bottle, tube, jar or strip)
- > The system is still some weeks away & may increase costs by 3-4% for the cos

middle-income countries are substandard or falsified, though these could be found in every region of the world, according to the World Health Organization.

In June, the government asked pharma companies to affix barcodes or QR codes on their primary or secondary package label that store data or information legible with software applications to facilitate authentication.

Once the software is in place, consumers will be able to check the genuineness of the medicine by feeding the unique ID code on a portal (website) developed by the ministry, and later track it even through

a mobile phone or a text message. Several options are being studied, including setting up a central database agency as a single barcode provider for the entire industry, the sources said, adding it could take some weeks to implement.

"The implementation of the system will increase costs by 3-4%," an industry player said, adding that certain companies have voluntarily started putting in the QR code.

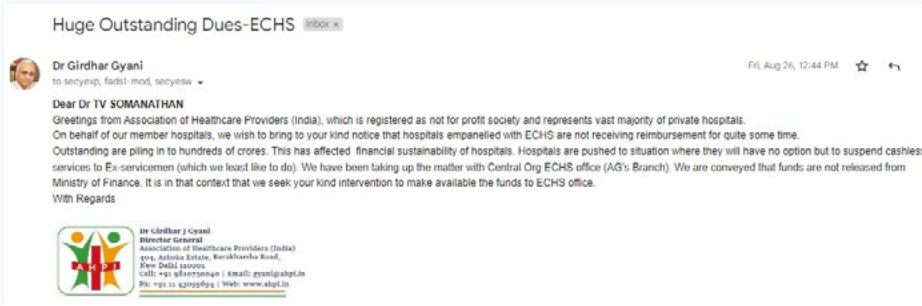
The proposed software solution should allow manufacturers and consumers to report counterfeit pharma codes using the handheld device and the mobile application, industry experts stated.

This has reference to the circular Z.16015/12/2022 dated 1st August 2022, asking for comments. AHPI as nct for profit society, represents vast majority of private hospitals. We are in general in agreement with contents in the document.

1. We have one observation vide section-II i.e. on 40-hours a week.
There is huge shortage of nurses in India. Most hospitals have 6-days working for nurses and that makes 48-hours. We may therefore be flexible on this until we have enough number, as otherwise hospitals will be required to hire more nurses and there are not enough in market.
2. Wide section III, we are in agreement to train nurses on leadership. In fact nurses can contribute much more if they are trained and groomed to add to their existing work profile which confine them to being bed side nurses only.
3. Wide section-IV on induction training. We have serious concern on the education in the nursing colleges. Hospitals have to spend 6-months to make them job ready. We need to improve the way nurses are being trained in colleges and schools in line with new Education Policy which focusses on Outcome Based education. We need to include more modules on patient safety and communication skills.

Subject: Notification dated 20th July to Insurers and TPAs

It has always been our collective endeavour to provide quality medical care while ensuring patient safety, which is a fundamental requirement in our efforts towards building a healthy India.

In line with this, after extensive discussion with all stakeholders IRDA had issued guidelines in 2016 which mandates that "providers offering cashless services for allopathic treatment shall meet with the pre-accreditation entry level standards laid down by National Accreditation Board for Hospitals (NABH) with a period of two years from the date of notification of these guidelines."

Please also note that NABH has prepared a guide book to help hospitals prepare for accreditation on their own, without need for expensive consultants. However, if needed, NABH can facilitate hand holding and guidance wherever required through partner organisations at a nominal fee.

Keeping above in view, the recent letter dated 20th July, empowering insurers to set their own standards for empanelling providers will firstly have different criteria's by insurers and therefore will lack uniformity and secondly it will not have same intensity and focus on patient safety as compared with certification by independent body like NABH. We therefore request you to reiterate the need for ensuring quality and patient safety in the empanelled hospitals, through an official communication from your end to the Insurers and TPAs to adhere to the requirement of NABH entry level pre accreditation as a requisite for empanelment.

We are appending below the past communications in this regard for your kind perusal:

Hospitals will be forced to close cashless facility if ECHS does not clear dues

- AIHP Chhattisgarh writes to ECHS Regional Director, Defence Minister, Defence Secretary and other officials.
- More than Rs 7,100 Crores outstanding from ECHS towards hospitals all over the country including Chhattisgarh.
- Ex-servicemen have made invaluable contribution towards the security of the country, hospitals want to provide them uninterrupted cashless healthcare facility.

Raipur (05.03.2023) Association of Healthcare Providers India (AIHP) Chhattisgarh Chapter has written to Ministry of Defence for release of outstanding payments to the hospitals of Chhattisgarh empanelled with Ex - Servicemen Contributory Health Scheme (ECHS). AIHP Chhattisgarh Chapter President Dr. Rakesh Gupta and Secretary Atal Singhania have written a letter to Regional Director, ECHS Jabalpur marking a copy to Defence Minister, Government of India, Rajnath Singh, Defence Secretary, Government of India, Joint Secretary, ESW and Station Headquarters of ECHS Raipur.

Dr. Rakesh Gupta informed that in the letter, AIHP Chhattisgarh has brought to the notice of the Defence Minister and officials that the bills of ECHS affiliated hospitals across the country, including Chhattisgarh, which are providing cashless medical services to Ex-Servicemen, have not been cleared by ECHS for a long time. On pursuing this matter with ECHS National Body, AIHP was informally informed that ECHS has run out of funds. There is an immediate requirement of about INR 2,100 Crores to cater to the outstanding and there is very less chance of this fund being allocated to ECHS.

AIHP has respectfully stated in the letter that in such a situation the empanelled hospitals of Chhattisgarh will be forced to stop providing cashless healthcare services to Ex-Servicemen. This will be very unfortunate to our Ex - Servicemen who have made invaluable contribution towards the security of our country but in case of non-payment of dues, hospitals will be left with no other option but to stop cashless treatment.

In the letter, AIHP has requested the Defence Minister and the authorities to take immediate cognizance of the matter and release the overdue payments to the hospitals so that healthcare facilities can be offered seamlessly to the Ex-Servicemen.

Solving the CGHS conundrum

Provisions in the new MoA could be counter-productive to the government's intentions, thus both sides must come to a more balanced agreement, that is a win-win for all sides

A consortia of healthcare industry associations, namely IMA, FICCI, ASSOCHAM, NATHEALTH and AHPI have expressed serious reservations about some of the new provisions in the revised Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) on the continued empanelment of private hospitals in the Central Government Health Schemes (CGHS).

The new MoA was supposed to come into force from October 1 but thanks to the efforts of the consortia and member hospitals, the last date for submission of the acceptance letter related to the new MOA has been extended to October 15. Officials from the associations indicated that efforts to get the contentious clauses dropped in the new MOA will continue, with the ultimate goal of getting a revision of the CGHS package rates which have not been revised since 2014.

The letter which has also copied Health Minister Shri Mansukh L Mandaviya covers six major concerns, the topmost being the non-revision of CGHS package rates for procedures for the past eight years. The letter points out that in these past eight years, hospitals have continued to pay annual increments to doctors and nurses, deal with rampant



increase in medicines and consumables, and pay more for all operating overheads. Their contention is that it is impossible

for hospitals to maintain acceptable standards of clinical quality at these rates.

While the government might be hoping that the resurgence in hospital bed occupancy rates and a slow return to profitability, justifies extracting more for CGHS beneficiaries, the fact is that it is the corporate chain hospitals which might be able to sustain these cuts. But most mid-sized hospitals, especially the standalone ones in smaller cities, might slip further into debt if they continue with the CGHS. If they are closed down or sold out, this might create accessibility issues for CGHS beneficiaries, which would be counter-productive to the government's intentions. Thus, the hope is that both sides can come to a more balanced agreement, that is a win-win for all sides.

The letter indicated that there are more contentious terms in the new MoA that will discourage private hospitals from continuing the scheme. While conveying their interest to continue working with the Government in PM's mission of providing healthcare for all, the signatories were clear that these and other concerns needed to be addressed.

Make shots for 60-plus free at pvt hospitals

Private hospitals protest CGHS discount order

PUNE: Private hospitals empanelled under the central government health scheme (CGHS) nationwide are up in arms against a revision that mandates them to price implants at 60% of MRP and give a minimum discount of 20% on prices of medicines and consumables.

"The revision is impractical and unsustainable. As per him, most major CGHS-empanelled private hospitals have decided not to give the letter of acceptance.

Private hospitals concerned over removal of payment clause in revised CGHS empanelment pact

Large private hospitals have expressed serious reservations over the removal of payment terms in a proposed agreement for empanelment with the Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS), saying this and other clauses will have a major impact on their ability to deliver seamless services.

"The newly proposed agreement has sought extension of empanelment and added new clauses which are of deep concern to hospitals," Girdhar Gyani, coordinator of the CGHS working group for

private healthcare providers, told Moneycontrol. "The government has very detailed clauses on the hospital's terms of operation, termination, penalty and performance clauses. However, there are no payment terms in the agreement."

The CGHS allows over 40 million serving and retired Central government employees to avail of medical treatment paying nominal monthly charges at government clinics and empanelled private hospitals and diagnostic centres.

MC Analysis | Why India's healthcare sector needs a national regulator

Last month, the Competition Commission of India found after a four-year investigation that some big hospitals were charging exorbitant prices for medical services.

Overcharging by hospitals has been a point of contention among patients for a long time. Government insurance schemes like CGHS, or for that matter private insurance companies, fix the prices for reimbursement, but on what basis? There is no answer as there has not been any scientific study on the costing of medical services in our country.

Accordingly, it needs to be ensured that any hospital offering healthcare services has the requisite infrastructure, personnel, equipment, and has standard operating procedures in place, commensurate with the scope of treatment services it intends to offer.

Quality healthcare is a basic need, and it has

moneycontrol direct impact on the wellbeing of society and national productivity. It is in this context that there should be independent/professional regulatory body for hospitals, which will balance both sides of the equation: the patients and the hospitals. Private sector healthcare providers face a plethora of problems, including harassment from the patients' side and from the many statutory agencies. This has dampened fresh investment in the health sector.

Given this, it will be in our national interest to have a professional regulator for hospitals, which can oversee all aspects including pricing of services in a scientific manner. The government only needs to work out how such a regulator will function across all states in India.

Pvt hospitals yet to get ₹1,300 cr CGHS dues, services stalled

Private hospitals have stopped offering services under the Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS) due to inordinate delays in receiving outstanding dues of over ₹1,300 crore from the government.

According to a person in the know, several CGHS empaneled hospitals have applied to the government to surrender their membership, but despite a series of meetings with union health ministry officials, pending dues have not been cleared for over six months, he added.

The development has also affected the 4.2 million CGHS beneficiaries, who get treated at subsidized rates at empaneled hospitals as well as wellness centres. Out of the total

CGHS claims of ₹3200 crore, bills worth ₹900 crore have so far been cleared.

In October, all major private hospital executives attended a meeting with CGHS Director General to resolve the issue but to no avail.

"All hospitals are frustrated with constant delays in clearing pending CGHS bills. We have been discussing with the authorities since June. With our constant efforts, CGHS is releasing small amount, which is insufficient for bigger hospitals. While hospital's pending bill is in crores, CGHS is releasing lakhs. The need of the hour is to clear pending bills in bulk to break the cycle," Dr Giridhar Gyani, the coordinator of the CGHS working group for private healthcare providers, said in an interview. Hospital executives are planning to meet the health minister in December,

Gyani added.

"Big hospitals like Medanta, Fortis, Narayana, Apollo, Max, and Manipal are pillars of the CGHS. If they withdraw their registration, the scheme will fail. So far, we have managed to stop them, but most small hospitals have started discontinuing the services. Gyani, who is

also the president of Association of Healthcare Providers of India (AHPPI), said.

Recently, the government issued an MoA (memorandum of agreement) directing hospitals to accept new guidelines under the CGHS, threatening to de-empanel them if they refused to do so. However, the

terms have been rejected by hospital operators.

"We have been telling the government to revise CGHS rates as they were not changed since 2014. However, the government has sent us revised MoA, directed hospitals to offer 20% discount on medicines, 40% on consumables. It has also scrapped the condition of 75% payment within 5 days, mentioned in the existing MoA," he said. The existing MoA of hospitals empaneled with CGHS will be valid till 31 December.

"In Delhi, for example, we see retired government officials, MPs and MLAs going for treatment at selected CGHS hospitals like Medanta, Fortis,

Narayana, Max and Manipal. We called a meeting of all the tertiary care hospitals and we have decided not to accept the fresh MoA," said Gyani.

Last year, the ministry had moved the CGHS on National Health Authority's IT platform to deliver healthcare services to eligible beneficiaries seamlessly.

The Centre is also pushing private hospitals to join Ayushman Bharat PM-JAY scheme. "In our last meeting, the health minister urged our hospitals to get empaneled for Ayushman Bharat but the poor experience with CGHS is forcing a majority of our big hospitals not to join PM-JAY, especially due to rate differences and payment delays," he said.

AHPI writes to Health Secretary regarding continuous empanelment of pvt hospitals



The Chhattisgarh Chapter of Association of Healthcare Providers-India (AHPPI) on Tuesday wrote a letter to the Secretary of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (Government of India) regarding continuous empanelment of private hospitals.

In the letter, Chhattisgarh Chapter of AHPI said that Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS) has sought extension of empanelment and has added new clauses which are of deep concern to the hospitals. CGHS Coordination Committee representing all

healthcare industry associations, namely IMA, FICCI, ASSOCHAM, NATHAHEALTH and AHPI had a discussion on 21st September 2022 on the new provisions in the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA). Representatives from key hospitals groups which included Medanta, Max Hospitals, Fortis Healthcare, Narayana Health, Yashoda Hospitals and many others also participated in the discussion.

The participants expressed serious reservations about some of the new provisions in the revised MOA. These changes will have a major impact on the ability of hospitals to deliver seamless service to CGHS beneficiaries without impacting the quality of healthcare. The major points that require review and reconsideration by CGHS/MOHFW include, continuation of 2014 CGHS Rates; region based CGHS tariff causing disparity; reimbursement of Rs.150 for OPD and emergency treatment; unlisted implants to be charged at 60% of MRP (Inclusive of GST) & minimum discount of 20% on the MRP of medicines & consumables; allowing chemotherapy drugs to be procured directly by CGHS beneficiaries; major surgery and minor surgery rates for uncodified procedures and no payment terms mentioned in agreement. The letter further added that there are some other contentious terms that will discourage private hospitals from continuing the scheme. We would all like to convey our interest to continue working with the Government in our Prime Minister's mission of providing healthcare for all. In view of the above, it is requested to convene a meeting with representatives from all industry associations to understand the concerns in detail before implementing the new MOA with changes as appropriate based on concerns raised above.

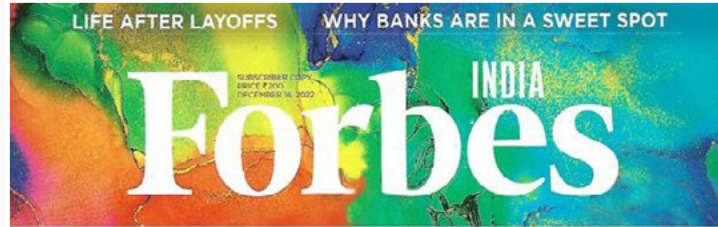

CG Chapter is partitioned in zones of Raipur, Bilaspur, Durg-Bhilai, Raigarh, Korba, Jagdalpur and Ambikapur. Each zone will have one coordinator, who will coordinate with the state coordinator to admit members. First meeting of Executive Committee will be held in December.

Dr Gupta invited the national leadership to the meeting to discuss policy reforms in health sector.
