








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#### Message from Patron, AHPI

### Solving the CGHS conundrum

Provisions in the new MoA could be counter-productive to the government's intentions, thus both sides must come to a more balanced agreement, that is a win-win for all sides

A consortia of healthcare industry associations, namely IMA, FICCI, ASSOCHAM, NATHEALTH and AHPI have expressed serious reservations about some of the new provisions in the revised Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) on the continued empanelment of private hospitals in the Central Government Health Schemes (CGHS).

The new MoA was supposed to come into force from October 1 but thanks to the efforts of the consortia and member hospitals, the last date for submission of the acceptance letter related to the new MOA has been extended to October 15. Officials from the associations indicated that efforts to get the contentious clauses dropped in the new MOA will continue, with the ultimate goal of getting a revision of the CGHS package rates which have not been revised since 2014.

The letter which has also copied Health Minister Shri Mansukh L Mandaviya covers six major concerns, the topmost being the non-revision of CGHS package rates for procedures for the past eight years. The letter points out that in these past eight years, hospitals have continued to pay annual increments to doctors and nurses, deal with rampant



increase in medicines and consumables, and pay more for all operating overheads. Their contention is that is impossible

for hospitals to maintain acceptable standards of clinical quality at these rates.

While the government might be hoping that the resurgence in hospital bed occupancy rates and a slow return to profitability, justifies extracting more for CGHS beneficiaries, the fact is that it is the corporate chain hospitals which might be able to sustain these cuts. But most mid-sized hospitals, especially the standalone ones in smaller cities, might slip further into debt if they continue with the CGHS. If they are closed down or sold out, this might create accessibility issues for CGHS beneficiaries, which would be counter-productive to the government's intentions. Thus, the hope is that both sides can come to a more balanced agreement, that is a win-win for all sides.

The letter indicated that there are more contentious terms in the new MoA that will discourage private hospitals from continuing the scheme. While conveying their interest to continue working with the Government in PM's mission of providing healthcare for all, the signatories were clear that these and other concerns needed to be addressed.

### Make shots for 60-plus free at pvt hospitals

## Private hospitals concerned over removal of payment clause in revised CGHS empanelment pact

Large private hospitals have expressed serious reservations over the removal of payment terms in a proposed agreement for empanelment with the Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS), saying this and other clauses will have a major impact on their ability to deliver seamless services.

"The newly proposed agreement has sought extension of empanelment and added new clauses which are of deep concern to hospitals," Girdhar Gyani, coordinator of the CGHS working group for

private healthcare providers, told Moneycontrol. "The government has very detailed clauses on the hospital's terms of operation, termination, penalty and performance clauses. However, there are no payment terms in the agreement."

The CGHS allows over 40 million serving and retired Central government employees to avail of medical treatment paying nominal monthly charges at government clinics and empanelled private hospitals and diagnostic centres.

## MC Analysis | Why India's healthcare sector needs a national regulator

Last month, the Competition Commission of India found after a four-year investigation that some big hospitals were charging exorbitant prices for medical services.

Overcharging by hospitals has been a point of contention among patients for a long time. Government insurance schemes like CGHS, or for that matter private insurance companies, fix the prices for reimbursement, but on what basis? There is no answer as there has not been any scientific study on the costing of medical services in our country.

Accordingly, it needs to be ensured that any hospital offering healthcare services has the requisite infrastructure, personnel, equipment, and has standard operating procedures in place, commensurate with the scope of treatment services it intends to offer.

It is in this context that there should be independent/professional regulatory body for hospitals, which will balance both sides of the equation: the patients and the hospitals. ## Pvt hospitals yet to get ₹1,300 cr CGHS dues, services stalled

rivate hospitals have stopped offering services under the Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS) due to inordinate delays in receiving outstanding dues of over ₹1,300 crore from the government.

According to a person in the know, several CGHS empanelled hospitals have applied to the government to surrender their membership, but despite a series of meetings with union health ministry officials, pending dues have not been cleared for over six months, he added.

The development has also affected the 4.2 million CGHS beneficiaries, who get treated at subsidized rates at empaneled hospitals as well as wellness centres. Out of the total CGHS claims of ₹3200 crore, bills worth ₹900 crore have so far been cleared.

In October, all major private hospital executives attended a meeting with CGHS Director General to resolve the issue but to no avail.

"All hospitals are frustrated with constant delays in clearing pending CGHS bills. We have been discussing with the authorities since June. With our constant efforts, CGHS is releasing small amount, which is insufficient for bigger hospitals. While hospital's pending bill is in crores. CGHS is releasing lakhs. The need of the hour is to clear pending bills in bulk to break the cycle," Dr Girdhar Gyani, the coordinator of the CGHS working group for private healthcare providers, said in an interview. Hospital executives are planning to meet the health minister in December,



The pending Central Government Health Scheme dues have not been cleared for over six months.

#### Gyani added.

"Big hospitals like Medanta, Fortis, Narayana, Apollo, Max, and Manipal are pillars of the CGHS. If they withdraw their registration, the scheme will fail. So far, we have managed to stop them, but most small hospitals have started discontinuing the services, Gyani, who is also the president of Association of Healthcare Providers of India (AHPI), said.

Recently, the government issued an MoA (memorandum of agreement) directing hospitals to accept new guidelines under the CGHS, threatening to de-empanel them if they refused to do so. However, the terms have been rejected by hospital operators.

"We have been telling the government to revise CGHS rates as they were not changed since 2014. However, the government has sent us revised MoA, directed hospitals to offer 20% dis-

count on medicines, 40% on consumables. It has also scrapped the condition of 75% payment within 5 days, mentioned rates under CGHS in the existing MoA," he said. The existing MoA

of hospitals empaneled with CGHS will be valid till 31 December.

"In Delhi, for example, we see retired government officials, MPs and MLAs going for treatment at selected CGHS hospitals like Medanta, Fortis, Narayana, Max and Manipal We called a meeting of all the tertiary care hospitals and we have decided not to accept the fresh MoA," said Gyani.
