## Message from Director General, AHPI

Association of Healthcare Providers (India) has completed 11-years of distinguish service for wellbeing of community at large. AHPI, though is primarily an advocacy body for healthcare providers, but while doing that job, wellbeing of community has always been upper most in our mind. All the time, AHPI has focussed on how India with huge population can come out stronger to provide affordable healthcare to society in general and underprivileged in particular. PMJAY, slowly and surely is making inroads in covering underprivileged population of our country. There are challenges in reaching out to eligible beneficiaries due to difficult terrain and in some cases lack of awareness. Once we are able to cover all those 500-million eligible population, and with other schemes like CGHS, ECHS, ESI, India will be close to be covering more than 60% of population. Adding those availing private insurance and employer insurance, India can touch close to 70% of population under some or other insurance and that will truly be great achievement by developing country like India.

While we have all the time being talking about affordability, AHPI recently undertook survey to understand issue related to accessibility and availability of healthcare services. It was realised that affordability would have relevance only when healthcare services were at first place available and accessible. Our study based on primary and secondary data available revealed that India has only less than 1.5 beds per 1000 population as against WHO norm of 3.5 beds per 1000 population. Further it was found that there exists huge disparity from state to state. For example, Karnataka has 4.2 beds per 1000 population, the Bihar on other hand has only 0.3 beds per 1000 population. AHPI has submitted complete report on this aspect to government of India as that should decide future course of policy intervention. Within the state similarly there is huge variation. For example, in the state of Tamil Nadu, the 50% of 100+ bedded hospitals are in two cities of Chennai and Coimbatore. Likewise, out of 125, 100+ bedded hospitals in Telangana, more than 100 such hospitals are in twin city of Hyderabad and Secundrabad.

Other important outcome of our study is that more than 85% of tertiary care beds are with private sector. It is incumbent that private and public sector work in tandem to make available the tertiary care to population in general and those covered under government schemes like PMJAY, CGHS etc. There exists formal arrangement that government empanel the private hospitals to make available the healthcare and in turn it makes reimbursement to the private hospitals. In principle it looks good model, except that government has not been able to arrive the rates of reimbursement on scientific basis. This deters most of tertiary and quaternity care hospitals in coming forward for empanelment and which again worsen the availability and accessibility of care. Government needs to assign task of costing of medical procedures to an authorised agency like Institute of cost accountant of India by which more hospitals will come forward for empanelment. Besides it will have big impact on financial sustainability of private sector and that will also attract more investment in healthcare in general and in deficient areas like tier-III cities in particular. AHPI has also submitted report to government on incentivising the private sector in setting up of 100-bedded tertiary care hospitals in tertiary care cities as that only will make healthcare available, accessible and affordable.







AHPI continues to lobby on behalf of all the hospitals with the Government regards to the inordinate delay in the reimbursement to hospitals and the low rates for reimbursement which have not been revised since 2014. As a result of the concerted efforts we have been able to get the rates revised for OPD fees, cardiology & surgical procedures . AHPI will follow up with CGHS as they work in the process of revising other specialty rates. AHPI through its intervention was able to get an extension of the validity period of already empaneled hospitals.





# **AHPI - National Medical Commission (NMC)**



### **AHPI - IRDAI**

According to the Global Youth Tobacco Survey 2019, 8 percentofschool children aged 13 to 15 years (average age 7.3 years) in Chhattisgarh are consument to bacco and related suming tobacco and related products and 26 percent youth are victims of passive smoking,

## Insurance firms unfairly rejecting claims: AHPI

The insurance companies are "unfairly" rejecting daims by patients and blatant-dividual programments of the insurance down by the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India, thus leaving the insured patients at the receiving end, The Association of Healthcare Providers India (AHPI) has said.

The AHPI which is a collective of hospitals and other healthcare providers has demanded action against such private insurance companies as it accused them of forming an "alarming cartel."

The AHPI contended that private insurance companies are collectively discontinuing are collectively discontinuing cashless facilities provided to hospitals, depriving patients of their right to choose treatment and healthcare providers in an arbitrary manner.

"As claims are denied, individuals find themselves in urgent need of funds to cover mounting medical"

Dr Girdhar Gyani, Director General of AHPI, said, "The AHPI's efforts to rectify this situation have been met with resistance. Several members from across the nation have also reported similar harassment by insurance companies, prompting us to take these concerns seriously." Consequently, we are now



NABII, during 2010-11, achieved the milestone of accrediting 100 hospitals. 


















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
